Kumihimo class scheduled for March 25th has been rescheduled for April 8th at 6:30.

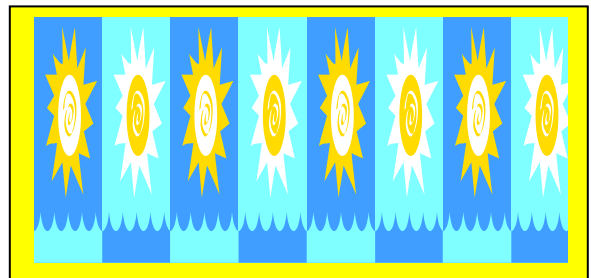
