NATIONAL COOKIE MONTH

Well hello everybody. Glad to be back for another month of fun and information. I know this will be hard to believe, but as I was continuing the cleaning of my craft room, guess what I found. A COLOR WHEEL!!! I don't remember buying it and I have no idea how long I have had it, still in the original packaging of course. So now I can fully begin to understand all of the info I gave last month. Now to continue with more information on the color wheel. (Courtesy of Fire Mountain Gems).

Colors can create physical and emotional reactions, acting on both the body and the mind. As a jewelry artist, color is one of the most significant design tools you have.

Here are the five basic color schemes:

MONOCHROMATIC COLOR SCHEME

The simplest way to create a beautiful piece is to use the same color throughout, but by using lighter and darker elements. Design idea H823

ANALOGOUS COLOR SCHEME

Always pleasing to the eye are colors that are close to each other on the wheel, like yellow to orange to red-orange. Design idea G72Z

COMPLEMENTARY COLOR SCHEME

Nothing stirs excitement like the eye candy, high contrast effect of a complementary color scheme. Complementary colors are directly opposite each other on the color wheel and are always stimulating if their hues are pure. Design idea GA39.

SPLIT COMPLEMENTARY SCHEME

This scheme combines the effect of the powerful complementary scheme with a variation on the analogous scheme. It offers intriguing possibilities in complexity and sophistication. Determine a key color. Then go directly across the color wheel to find its complement. Instead of the complement, use the two colors that you find next to it. In this example, the key color is red-violet. Design idea G853.

TRIADIC COLOR SCHEME

A triadic color scheme uses colors that are evenly spaced around the color wheel. Triadic color harmonies tend to be quite vibrant, even if you use pale or unsaturated versions of your hues. To use triadic harmony successfully, the colors should be carefully balanced- let one color

dominate and use the other two for accent. Design idea F97E.

You will notice after each description I have added a Design idea. If you go to Firemountaingems.com and plug in those numbers, you will see a representation of each idea. Happy hunting and good luck with your colors.
